

MySaskHealthRecord FAQ's

MySaskHealthRecord gives patients quick and easy access to their personal health information through a secure website or mobile app. Common questions include:

Q.How do I get a MySaskHealthRecord account?

To be eligible for an account, you need to be 14 or older, have a valid SGI driver's licence or SGI photo ID, have an active Saskatchewan Health Services card and have your own email address.

Q.What kind of information can I access through a MySaskHealthRecord account?

- Clinical visit history (displayed as inpatient, outpatient or emergency visits to a health care facility)
- Laboratory test results
- Medical imaging reports
- Immunization history
- Prescription history
- Clinical documents (Select clinical documents will be released through MySaskHealthRecord in a phasedapproach.)
- *NEW* surgical procedures

Q.What information is available under clinical documents?

After a medical visit, doctors, nurses and other healthcare providers write notes that summarize important information about you. These notes are called a clinical document

Q.What information is available under surgical procedures?

As you prepare for an upcoming surgery, you will be able to see:

- Scheduled procedure date
- Specialist/surgeon's name
- Procedure location
- Status of procedure
- Surgical procedure information from 2018 onwards

(Allow 7 - 14 business days following the consent discussion with your surgeon for new entries to appear.)
