




About eHS Vital Statistics Office (VSO)

 The VSO is responsible for the administration and enforcement of Saskatchewan's <u>Vital Statistics</u> <u>Act</u>.

 The VSO is mandated to register vital events, including death registration.







About the EDRN Project

- Part of a national-level push to digitize death registrations, coordinated by Service Canada/Employment and Social Development Canada:
 - Other jurisdictions are in various stages of development, implementation, and operation
- eHS VSO signed a letter of agreement with Service Canada in 2020 and has received funding to implement the EDRN website.
- The project aims to improve the timeliness and accuracy of death data, facilitated through the implementation of an electronic process to replace the current paperbased process.
- Ultimately, the EDRN system will enable timelier registration of death allowing administration of survivor benefits, estate requirements improving overall support to survivors during a difficult time.





EDRN: What's In It For You?

Physicians, nurse practitioners and hospital staff will benefit from the implementation of EDRN in the following ways:

- You will be able to complete and transmit Medical Certificates of Death (MCD) electronically. This means not having to deal with paper loss or misinterpretation of handwritten data.
- The EDRN website will be accessible anytime, anywhere in Saskatchewan, from any web-enabled device (laptops, tablets, smartphones, etc.)
- Key information will pre-populate where possible and smart search functions will be enabled, in an effort to minimize completion time and simplify workflow.
- MCD communication/transmission with coroners and/or funeral homes can be facilitated via the EDRN website













Sample Screenshot – Dashboard
