# Terms and Definitions

A summary of symbols, definitions, and the method of computing rates used in this report are given below.

## Definitions

<b>Population</b>	This report contains postcensal estimates for 1997 - 2000, 2002-2005; and, final census figures for 2001 and 2006.
<b>Live Births</b>	Infants born alive, i.e., excluding stillbirths.
<b>Stillbirths</b>	Fetal deaths occurring after at least 20 weeks pregnancy or after attaining a weight of at least 500 grams.
<b>Deaths</b>	Excludes stillbirths.
<b>Infant Deaths</b>	Deaths under 1 year of age.
<b>Neonatal Deaths</b>	Deaths under 28 days (4 weeks) of age.
<b>Perinatal Deaths</b>	Fetal deaths of 500 grams or more plus infant deaths under 7 days (1 week) of age.
<b>Natural Increase</b>	Excess of births over deaths.

## Rates (unless otherwise indicated, computed as follows)

<b>Live Births</b>	: per 1,000 population
<b>Stillbirths</b>	: per 1,000 live births
<b>Marriages</b>	: per 1,000 population
<b>Divorces</b>	: per 100,000 population
<b>Natural Increase</b>	: per 1,000 population

# Introduction

The Vital Statistics Annual Report represents a concise record of those vital events which occurred in Saskatchewan during the calendar year. The Report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of subsections 50(1) and 50(2) of *The Vital Statistics Act, 1995*.

The Vital Statistics Annual Report 2006 records vital events by place of occurrence for 2006 (vital events which occurred in Saskatchewan in 2006). It includes, for example, births to Saskatchewan residents who were in the province at the time of giving birth, as well as residents of other provinces (or countries) who were in Saskatchewan at the time of giving birth.

The data in this report are based on original registration forms and do not include amendments. The vital events recorded in this report for years previous to 2006 are by place of residence, unless otherwise indicated.

# A. Population

## 1. The Historical Trend

The estimated population of 985,386 for 2006 is a decrease of .46 percent from the 2005 estimated population of 989,957.

## 2. The Distribution of the Total Population by Age

The proportion of older people (65 years of age and over) has been increasing in Canada as a whole and in Saskatchewan. In Saskatchewan the proportion of persons 65 years of age and over is greater than in Canada as a whole (14.9 percent and 13.2 percent respectively).

## B. Births

### 1. Live Births

During the year 2006, a total of 12,427 live births occurred in the province of Saskatchewan. This total includes births to Saskatchewan mothers residing in the province at the time of giving birth and those births occurring to mothers who normally reside outside the province but who were in Saskatchewan at the time of giving birth.

The total of 12,427 live births represents a crude birth rate of 12.6 live births per 1,000 population, which is slightly higher than last year's birth rate of 12.2.

The birth rates for Saskatchewan, for Canada, and for the provinces and territories are shown below for comparison.

## 2. Stillbirths

During the year 2006, a total of 82 stillbirths occurred in the province. The definition of stillbirth is given on page 3. The 82 stillbirths occurred after 20 or more weeks gestation (or attaining a weight of 500 grams or more); 40 of the stillbirths occurred after 28 or more weeks gestation. These two totals represent crude rates of 6.6 and 3.2 stillbirths per 1,000 live births respectively.

## C. Deaths

During the year 2006, a total of 9,100 deaths occurred within the province of Saskatchewan. This represents a crude death rate of 9.2 deaths per 1,000 population.

The death rates for Saskatchewan, for Canada, and for the provinces are shown in the table below for comparison.

### **Accidents and Violence**

During the year 2006 a total of 428 deaths due to accidents occurred in the province of Saskatchewan. This represents a crude rate of 43.4 deaths by accidents per 100,000 population in 2006. This is higher than the 332 deaths (33.4 crude rate per 100,000 population) recorded in 2005.

## Accidents and Violence

The number of suicides that occurred in Saskatchewan during 2006 was 105. This represents a crude rate of 10.6 suicides per 100,000 population. This is higher than the 93 suicides (9.4 crude rate per 100,000 population) recorded in 2005.

There were 40 homicides in Saskatchewan in 2006, an increase from the 29 homicides reported in 2005.

## D. Natural Increase in Population

In 2006, the natural increase was 3,327 and the estimated actual increase was -4,571 giving rates per 1,000 population of 3.4 and -4.6 respectively.

## E. Marriages

During the year 2006, a total of 5,157 marriages were solemnized in Saskatchewan.

This total represents a crude rate of 5.2 marriages per 1,000 population. Marriage rates for Canada, the provinces, and Saskatchewan for 2005 are given in Table 10.

Of the 5,157 marriages registered in Saskatchewan in 2006, 33 of those marriages were between same sex partners.

## **F. Divorces**

In 2006, a total of 1,953 divorces were registered in Saskatchewan at the time of publication. This may not represent the total number of petitions filed in 2006 as some petitions may not yet be finalized.

## **G. Life Expectancy**

A life expectancy table is, in effect, the history of mortality of 100,000 male babies and of 100,000 female babies born at the same time. Life expectancy figures provide the average expectation of life and are a fairly good reflection of the general health and survival conditions at the time of their compilation.

According to Statistics Canada, the life expectancy at birth for Saskatchewan in 2004 was 82.1 years for females and 76.6 for males.

## H. Adoptions

There were 136 adoptions registered in Saskatchewan during 2006, compared to 143 adoptions in 2005. The total of 136 adoptions registered includes out-of-province adoptions of persons born in Saskatchewan as well as adoptions in Saskatchewan of persons born elsewhere.

## I. Legal Changes of Name

During 2006, a total of 809 legal change of name applications were registered in Saskatchewan. This represents a decrease from the 894 change of name applications that were registered in 2005. The number of applications does not reflect the number of persons who changed their name as each application may affect more than one person and in some cases, an entire family.
