



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Terms and Definitions

A summary of symbols, definitions, and the method of computing rates used in this report are given below.

Definitions

Population	This report contains post-censal estimates for 2002-2005, 2007 and 2008; and, final census figures for 2001 and 2006.
Live Births	Infants born alive, i.e. excluding stillbirths.
Stillbirths	Fetal deaths occurring after at least 20 weeks pregnancy or after attaining a weight of at least 500 grams.
Deaths	Excludes stillbirths.
Infant Deaths	Deaths under 1 year of age.
Neonatal Deaths	Deaths under 28 days (4 weeks) of age.
Perinatal Deaths	Fetal deaths of 500 grams or more plus infant deaths under 7 days (1 week) of age.
Natural Increase	Excess of births over deaths.

Rates (unless otherwise indicated, computed as follows)

Live Births	: per 1,000 population
Stillbirths	: per 1,000 live births
Marriages	: per 1,000 population
Natural Increase	: per 1,000 population

Introduction

The Vital Statistics Annual Report represents a concise record of those vital events which occurred in Saskatchewan during the calendar year. The Report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of subsections 50(1) and 50(2) of *The Vital Statistics Act, 1995*.

The Vital Statistics Annual Report 2008 records vital events by place of occurrence for 2008 (vital events which occurred in Saskatchewan in 2008). It includes, for example, births to Saskatchewan residents who were in the province at the time of giving birth, as well as residents of other provinces (or countries) who were in Saskatchewan at the time of giving birth.

The data in this report are based on original registration forms and do not include amendments.

In October of 2008, responsibility for the administration of vital statistics was transferred from Saskatchewan's Ministry of Health to the Information Services Corporation of Saskatchewan.

A. Population

1. The Historical Trend

The estimated population of 1,015,985 for 2008 is an increase of 1.6 per cent from the 2007 estimated population of 1,000,000.

2. The Distribution of the Total Population by Age

The proportion of older people (65 years of age and over) continued to increase in Canada as a whole but remained constant in Saskatchewan. In Saskatchewan the proportion of persons 65 years of age and over is greater than in Canada as a whole (14.9 per cent and 13.7 per cent respectively).

B. Births

1. Live Births

During the year 2008, a total of 13,968 live births occurred in the province of Saskatchewan. This total includes births to Saskatchewan mothers residing in the province at the time of giving birth and those births occurring to mothers who normally reside outside the province but who were in Saskatchewan at the time of giving birth.

The total of 13,968 live births represents a crude birth rate of 14.0 live births per 1,000 population, which is higher than last year's birth rate of 13.4.

The mid-year birth rates for Saskatchewan, for Canada, and for the provinces and territories are shown below for comparison.

2. Stillbirths

During the year 2008, a total of 81 stillbirths occurred in the province. The definition of stillbirth is given on page 3. The 81 stillbirths occurred after 20 or more weeks gestation (or attaining a weight of 500 grams or more); forty-five (45) of the stillbirths occurred after 28 or more weeks gestation (or attaining a weight of 500 grams or more). These two totals represent crude rates of 5.8 and 3.6 stillbirths per 1,000 live births respectively.

C. Deaths

During the year 2008, a total of 9,310 deaths occurred in the province. This represents a crude death rate of 9.3 deaths per 1,000 population.

The mid-year death rates for Saskatchewan, for Canada, and for the provinces are shown in the table below for comparison.

Accidents and Violence

During the year 2008, a total of 480 deaths due to accidents occurred in the province of Saskatchewan. This represents a crude rate of 47.2 deaths by accidents per 100,000 population in 2008. This is higher than the 373 deaths (37.4 crude rate per 100,000 population) recorded in 2007. The increase is largely the result of an increase in the number of deaths due to falls which rose from 94 in 2007, to 146 in 2008.

Accidents and Violence

The number of suicides that occurred in Saskatchewan during 2008 was 121. This represents a crude rate of 12.0 suicides per 100,000 population. This is slightly lower than the 126 suicides (12.6 crude rate per 100,000 population) recorded in 2007.

There were 18 homicides in Saskatchewan in 2008. This is lower than the 22 homicides reported in 2007.

D. Natural Increase in Population

In 2008, the natural increase was 4,658 and the estimated actual increase was 16,288 giving rates per 1,000 population of 4.6 and 16.0 respectively.

E. Marriages

During the year 2008, a total of 5,337 marriages were solemnized in Saskatchewan.

This total represents a crude rate of 5.3 marriages per 1,000 population. Marriage rates for Canada, the provinces, and Saskatchewan for 2007 are given in Table 10.

Of the 5,337 marriages registered in Saskatchewan in 2008, 35 of those marriages were between same sex partners.

F. Divorces

In 2008, a total of 1,848 divorces were registered in Saskatchewan at the time of publication. This may not represent the total number of petitions filed in 2008, as some petitions may not yet be finalized.

G. Adoptions

There were 178 adoptions registered in Saskatchewan during 2008, compared to 140 adoptions in 2007. The total of 178 adoptions registered includes out-of-province adoptions of persons born in Saskatchewan, as well as adoptions in Saskatchewan of persons born elsewhere.

H. Legal Changes of Name

During 2008, a total of 906 legal change of name applications were registered in Saskatchewan. This represents an increase from the 813 change of name applications that were registered in 2007. The number of applications does not reflect the number of persons who changed their name as each application may affect more than one person and in some cases, an entire family.
