

# MSHR Open Clinical Documents Medical Staff FAQ

MySaskHealthRecord gives patients quick and easy access to their personal health information through a secure website or mobile app. Common questions include:

## Q.How do I get a MySaskHealthRecord account?

To be eligible to register for an account, you need to be 14 years of age or older, have a valid SGI driver's license or SGI non-driver's photo ID, have an active Saskatchewan Health Services card and have your own email address.

## Q.What kind of information can I access through a MySaskHealthRecord account?

Clinical visit history (e.g. inpatient or emergency visits to an SHA health care facility) laboratory test results, medical imaging reports, immunization history, prescription history and surgical procedures.

## Q.What information is available under clinical documents?

After a medical visit to an SHA health care facility, doctors, nurse practitioners and other health care providers write notes that summarize important information about your visit. These notes are called a clinical document and may include:

- Summary of what a patient has told the clinician (also called a patient history)
- Provider's interpretations of lab tests, x-rays, or other investigations
- Recommendations made during the visit (also called a treatment care plan), which may include tests, follow-up appointments, referrals, etc.
- Physical examination findings
- Details of a procedure
- Summary of a patient's health care visit

***(Not all providers in Saskatchewan are connected to MySaskHealthRecord. Providers' notes from their private clinics will not appear in MySaskHealthRecord at this time as they are not connected to the same IT system as providers who are based in SHA facilities.)***

## Q.What information is available under surgical procedures?

As patients prepare for surgery, you will be able to see:

- Scheduled procedure date
- Specialist/surgeon's name
- Procedure location
- Status of procedure
- Surgical procedure information from 2018 onwards

*(Allow 7 – 14 business days following the consent discussion with your surgeon for new entries to appear.)*

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
