

MySaskHealthRecord Surgical Procedures

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MySaskHealthRecord (MSHR) gives patients and their families access to provincial laboratory results, medical imaging reports, immunization history, clinical visit history, prescription history and select open clinical documents. Surgical Procedures information such as date scheduled, location, surgeon and procedure is recorded in the Saskatchewan Surgical Registry. Work is underway to make this information readily available to patients in MSHR. Patients preparing for surgery who have a MSHR account will be better informed about where they are in their surgical journey, from referral to the confirmed surgery date.


Benefits:

Access to information about upcoming surgical procedures helps patients prepare for appointments, allows them to be more involved in managing their own health care, and reduces uncertainty and anxiety. Health care providers can spend less time answering questions about surgery dates and times, and more time focused on patient care.

Implementation plan and functionality:

Surgical Procedures functionality and data will be live in March 2024. This includes:

- · Waitlist date, scheduled date and procedure
- Email and in-app notifications when information is updated
- Manual and automatic reminders
- Surgical procedure history



Please note that surgical procedures information will not be available in the eHR viewer, only in the patient's MSHR account.
