About the IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere

IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere enhances the IntelliSpace PACS product portfolio by providing the ability for clinicians and administrators to access patient information, images and diagnostic reports via a zero footprint, platform independent application. IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere allow users the ability to review patient exams, images and diagnostic reports on any desktop, laptop or mobile tablet which supports HTML5 compliant browsers (e.g., Chrome, Safari, MS Internet Explorer v10). It enables users to:

- Search for, discover, and display patient images, relevant exam information, prior exams, and diagnostic reports
- Access the Canvas Page via the EMR with one authentication (via login to the EMR) for quick and easy access to exam images and reports
- Utilize Philips patented iSyntax compression for fast, high quality performance when accessing patient information and navigating through studies. Customer IT managers and administrators can offer enterprise access to a large number of concurrent mobile users without needing complex hardware.
- Facilitate communication and collaboration between Radiologists and clinicians via email messages with embedded exam and report links
- Manage Critical Findings through integration with the IntelliSpace PACS Workflow Layer
- Integrate an audit trail with IntelliSpace PACS
- View images and videos imported from the IntelliSpace VL Capture iOS app, and images imported from the IntelliSpace VL Capture web application

IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere supports multi-touch gestures on mobile devices, such as tablets. and features dynamic user interface orientation, based on whether the device is in Portrait or Landscape mode (for tablets) or the size of the window (for desktop or laptop browsers).

The accuracy of measurements depends on multiple factors that determine image quality:

- The accuracy of patient positioning and fixation
- Patient motion and organ motion
- The modality type and acquisition protocol, acquisition and reconstruction distortions
- Image resolution: both spatial and contrast resolution

Introduction Auditing

Measuring

The ability to accurately place a measurement control point on an image displayed on a monitor is the major factor that determines the accuracy of measurements. In addition, the image viewing settings in IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere influence measurement accuracy.

Settings such as gray level, window width, zoom and others may affect how users perceive the dimensions of the anatomy displayed on the screen. These settings also influence the accuracy of positioning measurement control points with a mouse pointer.

The clinical user is responsible to judge the accuracy of the measurements based on the image quality and based on the accuracy of placing measurement control points

Intellispace PACS Anywhere has many security controls that help protect privacy, integrity, confidentiality and availability of personal data, including:

- User authentication is based on the LDAP MS Active Directory within a specific customer only.
- Audit logging of access to IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere is captured via the IntelliSpace PACS audit logs.
- IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere does not have encryption at rest. IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere
 has encryption in transit via HTTPS with transport layer security within the customer's
 virtual private network. IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere has limited Role-Based Access Controls
 established at the Intellispace PACS level and managed by the customer's internal policies
 and practices.
- Network Security is managed by the customer per the customer's policy and procedures, including intrusion detection, and intrusion prevention. User account maintenance is managed by the customer per the customer's policy and procedures. Password configurations are managed by the customer's policies and procedures. Application settings, including, but not limited to auto-logoff, is managed by the customer's policies and procedures.
- Please adhere to your site security policy to establish strong passwords and take appropriate measures to secure the network environment to prevent access by unauthorized users and possible modification to patient data.

IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere allows for cookie collection, which is disclosed in the Privacy Notice. Cookies are only collected during the client's active session and are used to maintain the authorization of the current client session. The cookies are encrypted by the Web Server when not be used by the Web Server to authenticate user access.

Security and Privacy Requirements

It is the policy of Philips Healthcare to adhere to all the required standards and regulations. To assist the hospital in fulfilling the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) requirements, introduced by the United States Department of Health and Human Services, the following functionality has been added to the IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere system:

Access Control

Intended to restrict access to the system to authorized users only:

- customizable on/off, a user Log-on/Log-off procedure is required to gain access to the system. Take care that a suitable password procedure is used to log on to your IT equipment, for instance:
 - use a mixture of upper- and lower-case letters, digits, and special characters
 - change the password frequently

access to the system is granted according to a customizable list of authorized users.

Audit Trail

Required to log user activities which are critical to information security:

- applies to logging-on, reading and/or modifying clinical information
- requires that means be provided for auto-backup on a hospital server, for example the use
 of an external standard 'Syslog' server.

Network Time Synchronization

Intended to synchronize system time to an external time-standard:

- uses a standard Network Time Protocol (NTP).
- the coupling is configured by Field Service during system installation.

Computer systems cannot be guaranteed to be safe in an insecure network. The user should provide some level of network protection e.g. installing firewalls.

Secure Network Connection

For internet connections IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere supports the HTTPS protocol with Transport Layer Security (TLS) encryption. Because the standard HTTP protocol does not implement any security control, allowing interception of transmitted data by unauthorized parties, it is no longer supported. Also the outdated Secure Sockets Layer (SSL) cryptographic protocol is no longer supported for HTTPS connections.

Use of the HTTPS protocol requires a digital certificate to be installed and used on the system. The installation and configuration instructions for this certificate are mentioned in the [add name of the document] accompanying the product.

Field Service

Field Service is used to enable the following configuration items based on information supplied by the hospital:

- · authentication and encryption
- time synchronization
- configuration of the 'Syslog' server
- configuration of any other programs

IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere user's have the exam access, permissions and login credentials provided to them by their PACS Administrator for IntelliSpace PACS Enterprise and/or IntelliSpace PACS Radiology. Users must be an authorized Workflow Layer user to Mail Messaging and Critical Findings.

Unique passwords prevent users from sharing the same user preferences and prevents one user from deleting or changing the user preferences of other users. You should never share your User ID and password.

Login Banner

On opening the IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere, you will see a Login Banner. The login banner is an electronic message that provides Notice of legal rights to users of computer networks and warn about unauthorized access to the application.



- Read the information provided and click OK to login to the application.
- Click OK to go to the Login page.


Logging In

Depending on your device, you launch IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere from a bookmark or icon.


1. On the logon page, enter your IntelliSpace PACS **Username** and **Password**.

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Getting Started Logging In



- In the **Log on to** field, select the appropriate authentication scheme.
 - In the Log on to field, ISITE will be selected by default. If an external authentication source is configured for the user, then it will be displayed in the Log on to drop-down list.
 - Click the Log on to drop-down list and select a configured external authentication.



In the Logon Mode field, select the configured Logon Mode. Password is selected by default. If the selected external authentication source is configured with both Password and Certificate Supported Credentials, then both Password and Certificate will be available.





A clip captured at a resolution of 1024 x 1024 can be played back at a resolution of 256 x 256. When you do this, series play cine clip is loaded faster because there is less data retrieved from the server, but the quality is lower. If the stack series is displayed at 256 x 256 it will be stretched to fit the window size. If the "Recommended Display Frame tag (0008,2144)" is present, it is used as the initial frame rate. If this DICOM tag is not present, IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere looks for the "Cine Rate" DICOM tag (0018,0040). If neither of these tags are present, the specified Default Cine Rate is used as the initial frame rate.
 - Prefetch Image: Select to improve the performance of Cine and manual scrolling.
 - Overlay Font Size: Set the desired font size for overlays on diagnostic images to Large, Medium, or Small.
 - Overlay brightness (%): Enter the desired brightness (in percent) for image overlays
 displayed over diagnostic images. For the most visible overlays, use a higher number.
- Review or change the Advanced Settings:
 - Memory limit: Specify the memory cache limit in MB. The memory cache limit setting
 helps manage the available memory for optimum performance of IntelliSpace PACS
 Anywhere. This setting should be reduced if you experience frequent application
 crashes. You must log out and log back into IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere for this setting
 to take effect.





By default, the Dashboard only shows the patients that have at least one exam belonging to the provider for that user. Certain users can be given permission to select in the Settings panel whether to view only their own exams or all the exams in the ordering location to which they are assigned. For users with the proper permission, the Full Access button displays at the top of the application. This allows users with the proper permission to access all exams. 
IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere supports simple patient based searches directly from the Dashboard as well as more complex patient and exam based searches using the Advanced Search page to specify search criteria. You can save a set of search criteria and make it the default. Searches are queried against a single, default IntelliSpace PACS database.

An error message is displayed if incorrect patient/exam information is entered for simple or advanced patient searches.

The Dashboard initially displays an alphabetical list of patients with exams taken within the last 24 hours; you can refine the search to view the sort order of the patients you want to see.

- Log into IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere. The Dashboard displays.
- 2. If desired, press **Sort** to change the way patient information is displayed.

If a blue plus sign is displayed to the left of the patient name, you can view the available exams for the patient.




Quick patient based searches

Multi-phase studies contain multiple images with the same location identifier. Paging through a multi-phase series that has not has been split typically results in jumping back to the first slice location each time you reach the end of each phase within the series. If you use the Localizer tool to navigate through a multi-phase series, you will notice that the other linked series are synchronized on location and basically display the image with closest location to the one displayed in the master series. If the non multi-phase series is used as the master, IntelliSpace PACS tries to find the image with the closest location in the multi-phase series, and because there are potentially multiple matches, IntelliSpace PACS displays the best match from the first phase. (In this example IntelliSpace PACS would never display image 7 through 12.) In other words, you cannot review all images of a multi-phase series by paging through another series while using the Localizer tool.

The selected study will now be highlighted, and the corresponding series will be displayed on the thumbnail strip.

- Select a series from the thumbnail to be viewed in the Canvas page.
 The existing series in the layout that was selected will be replaced with the currently selected series.
- 7. The selected exam in the timeline will be given another color.
- 8. Repeat steps "5" to "7" above to select another two different studies and open one series of the two studies to be viewed in the layout.
- 9. The Canvas page will have four series of four different studies.



The four studies will have four different colors. Also the series displayed in the Canvas page will have the respective colors.

10. Click the Image Swapping button and drag the button to another quadrant to change the position of the images within the quadrants.



- 11. Double click on the Canvas page or roll the mouse wheel when on the selected image to hide the thumbnail strip and the image header to view the image in full screen.
- 12. Double click on the Canvas page again to see the image header.
- 13. Click the Back to see the thumbnail strip again.
- 14. Click the dotted button beside the Layout button.



- 15. Click the Linking button to view the linked images.
- 16. Click the Scout Lines button to automatically display the scout lines on single images or a stack series. Scout lines are displayed only on cross sectional image series like CT, MR, PET, PET/CT and PET/MR.

Using The Scout Lines Tool

The Scout tool allows you to see the planar location of an image using another image within the same study as a reference frame. Scout lines are displayed on the image or series as you move your mouse over other images of a different orientation. The Scout tool is available for CT, MR, and PT modalities.

Linking Image Series

The Link feature allows you to do the following:

Presentation states Working with Images

 Synchronize multiple images or series with an image or series that you have designated as the "master".

- Multiple Linking between Main and Priors images.
- Link two or more images and zoom, pan, or view slices simultaneously.

Aligning Linked Series

DICOM contains information as to the frame of reference, which provides exact information as to the location of the patient at the time of scanning. Typically, images in the same exam have the same frames of reference, and images in different exams have a different frame of reference.

If the linked series have the same frame of reference, IntelliSpace PACS automatically aligns them when the link is created. If the linked series do not have the same frame of reference, IntelliSpace PACS cannot perform the initial alignment automatically. In this case, it relies on the user to align the series before linking them, and then uses information about the slice spacing to synchronize them as you navigate through the series.

You can adjust the initial manual or automatic alignment by temporarily disconnecting a seriesimage from a link, and manipulating each independently by pressing the **Shift** key while performing mouse or keyboard actions.

Presentation states

A presentation state shows the state of an exam as last viewed. For example, if an IntelliSpace PACS Enterprise or Radiology user opened an exam, cined to particular slices in a series and adjusted the Window Width and Level values, then saved the presentation state, this configuration of the exam is preserved. Some features, such as the location of Scout Lines and the Localizer Tool, are not preserved in presentation states.

IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere supports the display of a limited set of Presentation States that were created in IntelliSpace PACS Enterprise or IntelliSpace PACS Radiology. You can view the Key images for the corresponding Presentation State. Pressing the **PS** icon displays a list of Presentation States.

- Line

- Text

You can add the following annotations to displayed Presentation States. Note that you cannot save these added annotations back to the loaded Presentation State:

The initial presentation state of an exam depends on which presentation states are available. The following types of presentation states are available:

- Original DICOM
- Technologist
- Pre-read
- User

These types are weighted. For example, if no presentation states have been created, the initial presentation state is the Original DICOM state. If a Technologist has created a presentation state, that will be presented first instead of the Original DICOM. If a Radiologist has created a presentation state, that will be presented first instead of the Technologist's presentation state.

The Canvas page of the IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere provides the users with the option to view the DICOM 6000 Overlays associated with the studies. For the studies that have the DICOM 6000 Overlays, the Study information header comes with a toggle button to view/hide the DICOM 6000 Overlays. Also, the 16 groups (DICOM standard) are color coded for easy identification of the overlay categories.

To view DICOM 6000 Overlays follow the steps:

1. Open a study with DICOM 6000 Overlays.







8 Working with Mail Messages

The **Messages** panel allows IntelliSpace PACS Workflow Layer users to send mail messages with exam links to IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere users (for example, referring physicians, specialists, consulting physicians, primary care providers, surgeons, and so on) for communication and collaboration.

You can do the following for mail messages that were generated in the Communication Management module of IntelliSpace PACS Workflow Layer:

- · Reply or Reply All to mail messages with the original mail message included
- Forward mail messages to other users, with the original mail message included
- Send, forward, or reply to an exam link or an exam link with presentation state, allowing users to view key images and access the full study.
- Delete a mail message

NOTE

The IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere does not support sending hyper-links in emails. An toaster message will be displayed when you try to send a mail with a hyper-link:

Invalid Mail Subject or Mail Content.


The Dashboard displays up to 20 mail messages for the user. Unread messages are indicated with a yellow unopened envelope icon; read messages are indicated with a white opened envelope icon. If a new mail message arrives while you are using another feature of IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere, the Messages icon/control on the bottom toolbar highlights. The total number of unread mail messages is displayed; the count is updated every two minutes. A maximum of 50 latest messages can be displayed; a message displays if there are more than 50 messages.

Note the following when viewing messages in Portrait mode:


- Pressing the Messages icon at the bottom of the screen displays the first message.
- Scrolling to and pressing the desired message opens the details for that message.
- On a desktop, laptop, or touch device, you can press the **Messages** button or press the left corner of the list to open the complete list of messages. On a touch device, you can swipe one finger right to see the list and one finger left to hide the list, or press the **Messages** button to display the complete list.

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From the Dashboard, select a message. The Messages panel displays the list of messages
on one side and the currently selected message on the other side. Alternately you can
select the Messages control on the Dashboard to display the Messages panel with the
messages default sorted descending by date with the most recent message selected.

Press the Mail icon to open a reply window, or press and hold to display and chose the other mail options.

Displays a prompt asking if you want to delete the current message. A confirmation message displays. To delete multiple messages, press the Edit button, select the check box next to the messages you want to delete, and press the Delete button. A confirmation message displays.

9 Working with Critical Findings

The **Critical Findings** panel enables you to follow-up on Critical Findings created for patient exams entered in IntelliSpace PACS Workflow Layer. Critical Findings are used to document communication between radiologists and referring physicians when a radiologist discovers a critical or non-urgent condition in an exam.

You can do the following for Critical Findings that were generated in the Critical Findings module of IntelliSpace PACS Workflow Layer:


- View the number of open Critical Findings and their category (Non-Critical, Critical, No Finding) and view details and history
- View exam images and diagnostic reports related to the Critical Finding
- · Add comments to Critical Findings to document communication with the referring physician
- Close Critical Findings

Initially, the Dashboard displays the number of open Critical Findings that were added in the last 96 hours (displayed as 4 days), relative to the Server time and still in the Open state. If a new Critical Finding arrives while you are using another feature of IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere, the **Critical Finding** button on the bottom toolbar highlights. The Critical Findings count is updated every two minutes.


Note the following when viewing critical findings in Portrait mode:

- Pressing the Critical Finding icon at the bottom of the screen displays the first critical finding.
- Scrolling to and pressing the desired critical finding opens the details for that finding.
- On a desktop, laptop, or touch device, you can press the **Critical Finding** button or press the left corner of the findings list to open the complete list of critical findings. On a touch device, you can swipe one finger right to see the list and one finger left to hide the list, or press the **Critical Finding** button to display the complete list.
- From the Dashboard, review the Critical Finding panel, noting the degree of criticality of the findings (critical or non critical).
 - Green: No Critical Finding (normal)
 - Yellow: Non-Critical Clinical Finding (abnormal)
 - Red: Critical Finding
- If desired, select Sort to choose how you would like the Critical Findings to be displayed:

The left side displays all the Critical Findings; the right side displays details about the selected Critical Finding, including links to images and/or reports. Alternately you can display the Critical Finding panel by selecting the Critical Finding control on the Dashboard.

Customer's Role in the Product Security Partnership

Philips recognizes that the security of Philips Healthcare products is an important part of your facility's security strategy. However, these benefits can only be realized if you implement a comprehensive, multi layered strategy (including policies, processes, and technologies) to protect information and systems from external and internal threats.

The customer is responsible for setting up and maintaining a secure and stable IT environment according to general IT standards.

Following industry-standard practice, your strategy should address:

- Physical security (e.g., do not allow unauthorized people to use IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere)
- Operational security (e.g., make sure that any sensitive information left on the system—such as exported files—is removed; make sure that users of IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere do not leave the open system unattended)
- Procedural security (e.g., create awareness with regard to the dangers of social engineering; every single user should be given a separate account; do not forget to remove an account when it is no longer needed)
- Risk management
- Security policies (e.g., make sure that the IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere Service Documentation and media are securely stored)
- Contingency planning.

The practical implementation of technical security elements varies by site and may employ a number of technologies, including firewalls, virus scanning and anti-spyware software, authentication technologies, network segmentation (VLAN—Virtual Local Area Network), etc.

As with any computer-based system, protection must be provided such that firewalls and/or other security devices are in place between the medical system and any externally accessible systems.

Although the system incorporates state-of-the-art protection mechanisms to protect it against the intrusion of malware (for example, viruses), a remote possibility remains that a system can become infected. System safety remains guaranteed in all circumstances, but the user might notice unfamiliar system behavior and/or performance. If this happens repeatedly, e.g. also after the system has been switched off and on again, the user is advised to contact a Philips Healthcare service representative to have the system checked and, if needed, to remove the malware.

The USA Veterans Administration has developed a widely used Medical Device Isolation Architecture for this purpose. Such perimeter and network defenses are essential elements in a comprehensive medical device security strategy.

Drag

To move the mouse while holding the left mouse button down or to press down and moving the finger on a touch interface device.

EMR

Electronic Medical Record. IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere supports URL based EMR integration, allowing clinician access to the IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere Canvas Page via their EMR. In this configuration, a user authenticates only once (via login to their EMR) and can launch the IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere Canvas Page for quick and easy access to exam images and reports.

JPEG

JPEG is a commonly used method of lossy compression for digital photography (image). The degree of compression can be adjusted, allowing a selectable tradeoff between storage size and image quality. JPEG typically achieves 10:1 compression with little perceptible loss in image quality.

iSyntax

iSyntax is a communication protocol technology used to transmit scalable, lossless representation of pixel data to a client in the IntelliSpace PACS system and is a registered trademark of Koninklijke Philips N.V.

MRN

Medical Record Number.

PACS

Picture Archiving and Communication System.

Presentation State

The presentation state of images or series refers to the attributes which determine how the images or series are displayed, e.g., whether or not annotations and measurements are shown.

Press

To click with a mouse or hold down with a finger on a touch interface device.

Tablet

A tablet-sized computer that also has the key features of a full-size personal computer. A tablet PC is essentially a small laptop computer, equipped with a rotatable touchscreen as an additional input device.

Glossary

The term was made popular with the Microsoft Tablet PC concept presented by Microsoft in 2001. Today, the term tablet is also used to refer to computer-like devices operated primarily by a touch screen but not intended to run general PC operating systems or applications.

Window Width/Window Level

Window Width is the total range of pixel values displayed on the screen. Increasing the window width will decrease the contrast. Window Level is the value of the pixels at the center of the range defined by window width. Increasing the window level will decrease the brightness.

Workflow Layer

A set of applications loaded via plug-ins to IntelliSpace PACS. IntelliSpace PACS Anywhere integrates information from the Communication Management and Critical Findings Management modules of Workflow Layer.

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
