POLICY:

All clients will have immunization consent directives (Grant) for all provider <u>administered</u> vaccines documented in Panorama. Consent directives will be required for all provider recorded vaccines where previous consent has been obtained but is not yet documented in Panorama.

PURPOSE:

A standardized informed consent process ensures accurate and timely availability of consent information for the client. Documentation of consent directives contributes to the overall quality and safety of immunization services.

Obtaining a valid, informed consent is a professional and legal responsibility and is a prerequisite before providing immunization services (Saskatchewan Immunization Manual, Chapter 3 *Informed Consent* – page 3). Documentation of granted consents in Panorama will provied current and accurate information to ensure that only those vaccines that are consented to are provided.

PROCEDURE:

Prior to or at the point of service, the immunization provider must follow the steps to obtain an informed consent for the client as detailed in Chapter 3 *Informed Consent* in the *Saskatchewan Immunization Manual*, Policy B of the Provincial School Immunization Strategy, and according to Regional Health Authority policies where applicable.

Consent directives will be documented in Panorama according to the following steps:

- At the time of first presentation for a vaccine/vaccine series, an informed consent for the eligible vaccine/vaccine series must be obtained from the client or the parent or authorized guardian of a child.
 - Consent will also need to be obtained and documented in Panorama in those instances when a client presents for an immunization and a previous consent had been obtained but is not documented in Panorama.
 - A written consent that is available on file¹ does not satisfy the expectation to create the corresponding record of consent in Panorama.
 - If a regional requirement for obtaining a written consent has already been fulfilled at a previous visit, the PHN will only need to obtain the "verbal" consent for recording in Panorama.
- Consent for a vaccine/vaccine series only needs to be documented once in Panorama, regardless of the RHA/FNJ who documented the consent.

¹ This also applies to children who have moved to Saskatchewan but who started their immunization series elsewhere.

Documentation of consent for the client is added (and updated) in the <u>Maintain Consent For</u> <u>Immunizations</u> screen (in <u>Consent Directives</u>).

- Complete the *Consent Given By* from the drop down menu.
 - For those less than 16 years of age: type the name of the person giving consent in the blank field to the right.
 - For those 16 years of age and older: "client" may be chosen in this field.
- The *Form of Consent* defaults to "verbal" and is changed to written as appropriate.
- Complete the *Consent Given To* field.
