POLICY:

Client laboratory results may be documented in Panorama if they:

- 1. Are relevant to immunization decision-making;
- 2. Cannot be adequately captured by a risk factor and/or special consideration; and
- 3. Are unavailable to a healthcare provider in another provincial electronic information system.

PURPOSE:

- 1. To minimize unnecessary client data entry;
- To ensure standard documentation of laboratory results that are unavailable in other provincial electronic information systems that are **relevant** to the documentation of risk factors (eligibility criteria for vaccines) and special consideration such as precautions, exemptions (immunity) and vaccine contraindications; and
- 3. To support the management of vaccine-preventable diseases outbreaks.

PROCEDURE:

The client's privacy, the protection of their **sensitive** personal health information and the minimization of data entry (e.g. result available in eHR Viewer, etc.) should always be considered when deciding whether to document immunization-related laboratory results that can be captured by a risk factor and/or special consideration.

Panorama users will discuss the documentation of laboratory results in Panorama with the client during the consent process where applicable (e.g., Chronic Medical Condition –Liver Disease – Hepatitis C). This should include an additional review of the current version of the *Protecting the Privacy of Your Immunization Record (PHNP 63)* fact sheet with the client.

Documentation in the <u>Immunization History Interpretation</u> screen **does not** engage the forecaster. If the laboratory results are available in another provincial electronic registry (e.g. the eHR viewer, LabWare LIMS Version 6, iPHIS), the user should consider the use of a risk factor category or a special consideration (in order to engage the vaccine forecaster) rather than entering a duplicate laboratory result in Panorama.

Immunization-related laboratory results should be entered as a separate event, even if they are being entered for the same disease. This is another opportunity to review and consider whether the client's entire immunization-related laboratory record (i.e.: available in the eHealth Viewer) should be entered into the client's record; or if the documentation of a risk factor, special consideration and a single laboratory result meet the immunization-related requirement for documentation.

The user will follow these steps to document an immunization-related laboratory result in the <u>Create Immunization History Interpretation</u> screen (in <u>Imms History Interpretation</u>) in Panorama:

- 1. Enter the interpretation of the immunization-related laboratory result by selecting the appropriate interpretation from the *Interpretation of Disease Immunity* drop-down list.
- 2. *Interpretation Date* will be the date that the results were reported on the laboratory results document.
- Enter the numerical laboratory result including the UOM followed by the test name (e.g. 324.6 MIU/ML – Rubella IgG) in the *Reference Data* field. The result and the test name should be entered exactly as recorded on the laboratory result report.
- 4. Enter "Lab serology" as the *Reason* unless another choice is more appropriate.
- 5. Documentation in the *Comments* field should be limited to need-to-know information only that directly impacts the provision of immunization services. Consider client privacy and consent when using the *Comments* field.
