

## Inventory Setup

### Panorama: Add Lot Number

#### **Purpose**

The purpose of this exercise is to add a new lot number to Panorama.

#### **Scenario**

SDCL has received a shipment of products and one of the items has a lot number not yet recorded in Panorama. The user in this scenario will add the lot number to Panorama so the product can be received.

#### **Steps are:**

- Search for a Lot Number
- If the Lot Number is found -> review information and update if necessary
- If The Lot Number is not found -> create a new one
  - Add new lot number
  - Add expiry date for the lot
  - Save

#### **Data required to add a Lot Number:**

- Catalogue name of the product
- Lot Number and Expiry Date

## Add New Lot Number - Steps

1	Log into Panorama.

# Using Product Lots

The Product Lot - Product Lot Search screen allows authorized users to locate a product lot by searching for a product lot number or catalogue item.

Lot information is captured when catalogue items are received from supplier/manufacturers as part of the Product Delivery Request (PDR) or requisition processes supporting movement of inventory among Holding Point Locations (HPLs). Lot information is displayed to users administering immunizations or drugs, and is used to support recall, adverse events, and adverse storage condition management.

## Searching Product Lots

You can locate a product lot by searching for a lot number or catalogue item. From the search results, you can update or add lot information. New lots can be added once prerequisite information (e.g. catalogue item) has been added.

### To search by product lot number

1. From the Lot Number field, enter the lot number you want to search.
2. Click the **Search** button.

The Product Lots that match the search criteria are displayed in the Product Lots Search Results section.

### To search by catalogue item

1. To select a catalogue item, click the Search Catalogue hyperlink.
2. The Catalogue Item Information screen is displayed. For details, see Using the Catalogue Item Information Screen.
3. Optionally, select a Lot Number.
4. Click the **Search** button.

The Product Lots that match the search criteria are displayed in the Product Lots Search Results section.

## Viewing Product Lot Details

You can view product lot details in the View Product Lot Details screen.

## To view product lot details

1. In the Product Lot Search Results section, click the appropriate **Lot Number** hyperlink.

The **Maintain Product Lot** screen displays the selected product lot and its associated details. This screen is read only. For details, see **Using the Maintain Product Lot Screen**.

# Updating Product Lots

## Editing a Product Lot

To edit a product lot, you must first select the lot in the Search screen. Once selected, you can extend or shorten the expiry date or inactivate the lot record if created in error.

You can create or edit a product lot in the Create/Edit Product Lot screen. Sublots can be created in the event of a cold chain break or a repackaged product.

## To update a product lot

1. In the Product Lot Search Results section, select the check box next to the lot you want to edit.

**Note:** Only one lot item can be selected for updating.

2. Click the **Update Product Lot** button.

The Maintain Product Lot screen is displayed. For details on updating product lots, see **Using the Maintain Product Lot Screen**.

3. Perform one or more of the following procedures:
  - Extend or shorten the current expiry date for the lot.
  - Inactivate a lot record created in error.
  - Activate a previously inactivated lot record.

## To extend or shorten the expiry date (based upon manufacturer instruction)

1. Update the Current Expiry Date field.
2. Optionally, attach a document. See **Adding Attachments**.
3. Click the **Save** button.

The Maintain Product Lot screen is updated.

## To inactivate a lot record

1. From the Lot Status drop-down list, select “Inactive”.
2. Optionally, attach a document. See **Adding Attachments**.
3. Click the **Save** button.

If products are in the system for that lot, the system displays an error message indicating the lot cannot be deactivated.

Otherwise, the Save function is completed and the Maintain Product Lot screen is updated with the status changed to Inactive.

## To activate an inactive lot record

You can activate a lot record that was previously inactive.

1. From the Lot Status drop-down list, select “Active”.
2. Optionally, attach a document. See **Adding Attachments**.
3. Click the **Save** button.

A confirmation prompt appears.

4. Click the **OK** button.

The Maintain Product Lot screen is updated with the status changed to Active.

## Creating Product Lots and Sublots

You can create a new product lot for a catalogue item. Sublots can be created in the event of a cold chain break or a repackaged product.

**Note:** You must perform a search prior to adding the new lot to ensure duplication does not occur.

## To add a product lot

1. Perform a catalogue item search to locate the catalogue item on which to base the product lot. See **Searching Product Lots**.
2. Click the **Add New Product Lot** button.

The Maintain Product Lot - Create/Edit Product Lot screen is displayed with the catalogue item selected and its associated data elements.

3. Enter the following lot information:
  - Lot Number
  - Current Expiry Date
  - Lot Status (defaults to Active if no selection is made)
4. Click the **Save** button.

The product lot is saved and you remain on the Maintain Product Lot - Create/Edit Product Lot screen showing a successful confirmation message.

## To create a subplot for a cold chain break

1. From the search screen results, select the check box next to the lot number for which you want to create a subplot.
2. Click the **Create Cold Chain Sublot** button.

The Maintain Product Lot - Create/Edit Product Lot screen is displayed with the Lot Type defaulted to Cold-Chain. The Lot # field is populated with a system generated lot number consisting of the selected lot # from the search results and the suffix with the next incremental cold chain subplot suffix for the specified lot.

3. In the Current Expiry Date field, enter the date for the new lot if necessary.
4. From the Lot Status drop-down list, select the status.
5. Click the **Save** button.

The product lot is saved and you remain on the Maintain Product Lot - Create/Edit Product Lot screen showing a successful confirmation message.

## To create a subplot for a repackaged product

1. From the search screen results, select the check box next to the lot number for which you want to create a subplot.
2. Click the **Create New Repackaged Sublot** button.

The Maintain Product Lot - Create/Edit Product Lot screen is displayed with the Lot Type defaulted to Repackaged-Lot. The Lot # field is populated with a system generated lot number consisting of the selected lot # from the search results and the suffix with the next incremental repackaged subplot suffix for the specified lot.

3. In the Current Expiry Date field, enter the date for the new lot if necessary.
4. From the Lot Status drop-down list, select the status.
5. Click the **Save** button.

The product lot is saved and you remain on the Maintain Product Lot - Create/Edit Product Lot screen showing a successful confirmation message.

### **To add comments to a Product Lot**

1. Enter comments as required in the Comment text box and click the **Add** button.

The comment along with the current date and the user who added it are displayed in the Comments table.

## **Adding Attachments**

You can attach a document to a product lot on the Maintain Product Lot - Create/Edit Product Lot screen.

**Note:** You can only attach documents when updating a Product Lot.

### **To attach a document**

1. Click the **Attach Document** button.

The Document Management screen is displayed. For further information on Document Management, see Using the Document Management Screen.

## **Viewing Product Lot History**

You can view the history of a product lot from the Maintain Product Lot - Create/Edit Product Lot screen.

### **To view the history of a product lot**

1. Click the **View History** button.

The Product Lot - View product Lot History screen is displayed.

**Note:** If attachments or documents exist for the product lot, the corresponding button is enabled in the View Product Lot History section.

### **To view the attachments for a product lot**

1. Click the **Attachments** button.

The Document Management screen is displayed. For further information on Document Management, see Using the Document Management Screen.

### **To close the Product Lot - View Product Lot History screen**

1. Click the **Close** button.

The Maintain Product Lot screen is displayed.

## **Printing Product Lot Details**

When a product lot is displayed on the Maintain Product Lot - Create/Edit Product Lot screen, you can print product lot details.

### **To print the details for a product lot**

1. Click the **Print Lot Details** button.

A print-friendly version of the Maintain Product Lot screen is displayed in a separate window ready for printing.

## Cancelling from the Maintain Product Lot Screen

You can cancel changes that have been made but have not yet been saved.

### To cancel changes

1. Click the **Cancel** button.

A confirmation prompt appears.

2. Click the **OK** button.

The data is cleared from the screen and the Product Lot screen is displayed.

## Printing Product Lot Information

You can print the Product Lot or Maintain Product Lot screen.

### To print product lot information

1. Click the **Print** icon, on the top right hand corner of the screen.
